New Session-New Initiatives

- **Abacus**

At LVIS,NE Abacus curriculum has been designed with a mission to implement high quality mental arithmetic based educational program to maximize children's mental ability. With the help of countable beads children learn to perform arithmetic calculations such as addition and division. This helps students aged 4-13 years develop skills such as multitasking, time management, memory, concentration and problem solving.

- **TedEd Club**

TedEd Club is an initiative started from October, 2019 for students of Grades 6-8. This club promotes critical thinking, communication and presentation skills in our students and gives them an online platform to spark curiosity and share ideas from around the world.

This club provides following opportunities to our students:

- to connect with students from different backgrounds, cultures and countries around the world
- to support students in their learning skills such as making a presentation to an audience and public speaking
- to work with a generation of problem solvers, critical thinkers and innovators to make the world a better place

- **Astronomy Club**

Astronomy Club helps open newer horizons for our students by providing them with proper resources and information about celestial objects to spark the curiosity and ignite a spirit of enquiry in the budding astronomers and scientists of the future. The knowledge and information in this field is so vast that there is no dearth of how much more one can learn about the Sun, the Moon, the Solar System and the far away galaxies. The children get to explore and try out new ideas, foster innovation and nurture creativity in the field of astronomy.

- **Project Awaaz**

The school has collaborated with Project AAWAAZ from the academic session 2019-20 onwards. This initiative not only helps the children to learn public speaking skills but also contributes towards their overall personality development. The Project Awaaz sessions focus on important aspects of public speaking such as expressions, body language, gestures, voice modulation, tone, and eye contact. The children learn these through exciting activities and fun games.

- **International Collaborative Learning**

In this era of globalization, there is an increased interdependence on the exchange between different countries for varied cultures, economies, policies and innovation. Under this initiative, in October 2019, our school collaborated with Mashrek International School in Jordan with an objective to establish an international exchange of experience and dialogue to be able to tackle global issues. This aimed at stimulating young minds and enabled the learners to develop and establish strategic policies and practices even at the local levels. The session was made possible over a Skype Video session where grade IV children got to learn a lot of new things!

- **STEAM**

STEAM enables the students to systematically think through problems and apply the information they learn about technology and engineering to find the best solutions. By experiencing trial and error, learning how to take risks and figuring out how to think outside the box, students get away from the commonly used approach of applying a known method or formula to solve a set of problems in a step-by-step way and rather learn through experiential learning and discover how something works, how to build it, and how to fix it.

- **Discover India**

This project is launched for the students of grades I-III. The programme inculcates research skills in the students and helps them learn about their motherland through art work, discussions, videos, presentations, cuisines, etc.

- **Impact Programme**

The programme has been introduced for classes Nursery-VIII to provide scaffolding to students to bridge the gaps in learning. Teachers adopt students and identify their socio, emotional and academic requirements and take appropriate measures to impact a positive change.

- **ICT Integration**

Information and communication technology has changed the way we think, work and live. The students use technology to make life better for the mankind. From research to flipped classrooms; from coding to designing; from using softwares for teaching and learning to using online tools of assessments, ICT is an intrinsic and integral part of our curriculum.

- **Art Integration**

Creative thinking underlines the learning process at LVIS, as it enthuses, excites and engages every learner as well as sparks their innovative thinking. In order to reinforce the concepts and theories learnt in the classrooms as well as to help our students enjoy the academic learning process, we integrate various art forms such as visual art, creative movement, crafts, drama, storytelling etc. with the subject content.

- **Flipped Classroom**

To make children the architects of their own learning and to hone their research and presentation skills from an early age, they don the hats of teachers and present lessons in their classes.

- **Peer Learning Programme**

The school, in an endeavour to empower students and impart leadership, started the initiative under which students from senior classes with their teachers provide mentorship to their juniors through life skills peer learning programme.

Subject Showcases

STEAM showcase was organised by the students of classes III-VIII on **22-23 October 2019** in the school premises. The students integrated the disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics and confidently presented innovative and interesting projects. The students worked with gusto and enthusiasm to become problem solvers by designing a Blindman's Stick, Smart Dustbins, Smart Cities, Automated Watering Systems, Robo Soccer, Floor Cleaner, Path Finder Bot. They found STEAM in Tessellation, Fibonacci Series, Tall Structures, Toys from Trash, Hydraulic Structures. The art displays representing various artists were mesmerizingly praiseworthy.

TED Ed. showcase was organised by the students of **grades VI-VIII** on **20 February 2020** after 4 months of exciting journey and mastering the art of delivering impactful TED Talks. The TED Ed. club has been created with the aim to spark and celebrate the idea & knowledge of teachers and students around the world.

Public Speaking Showcase was organised on **15 February 2020** where the students of **Project Awaaz** displayed plethora of activities and gave a glimpse of the nuances and art of public speaking and critical thinking that they learned in a year long journey.

Subject Weeks

- **Literary Week** was organised for the students of **grades III-VIII** from **13-17 May, 2019**. The week focussed on activities such as poetry writing, comic strip making, book cover designing and puppet show that helped the children hone their critical thinking, speaking and creative skills. At the end of the week, students showcased some of these activities before the parents. Competitions such as Spin a Yarn, English recitation, Tete-a-Tete with the Author and Hasya Kavi Sammelan enthralled the audience and kept them hooked till the end.
- **EVS Week** was organised by the **students of grades I & II** from **17 - 19 July, 2019**. The focus of the week was to sensitize the students about the conservation of water and to reflect the history of India. During this week, students found themselves delving into research, collaborating ideas and presenting their thoughts before one another. They participated in the activities such as collaborative poster making on 'how to save water', researched on the monuments of India and presented their ideas collectively in the classroom, navigated through the streets of India on Google Earth. The week ended with the students pledging to use water judiciously and spreading this message in the school through their 'Save the Water' drive. They also participated in 'My Country, My Pride' competition and represented different states of India to showcase its famous cuisines, wide number of languages, colourful accessories and its major attractions.
- **EVS and Social Science week** was celebrated **from 18th - 20th July 2019 for classes III-VIII**. It gave an opportunity to children to get involved into a gamut of fun-learning activities enabling students to engage themselves into social science research to exhibit the diversity of various cultures and their relevance in today's time. It emphasized on the nuances of creating and making social science a subject that goes beyond the classroom learning.
- LVISNE celebrated the **reading week 'Read-a-Thon'** on the occasion of International Literacy Day from **9 - 15 September, 2019 for all classes**. The aim of the week was to highlight the need of building opportunities for individualized reading at all stages and promote a culture of reading

habits among students. Students carried out various activities during this week like Book Cover Designing, Book Mark Making, Reinvention of the Stories etc. Students and teachers also took part in Book Donation Activity.

- The Pre-Primary wing organised a **Sports Week 'Fit-a-Thon'** for classes **Pre-Nursery - II**, from **4 - 16 December, 2019**. Students participated in various track events and were guided & encouraged by the teachers present. Loud roars of applause were heard, as students cheered for their peers. Happy faces filled the field as the prize winners stood proudly to accept their certificates on the podium.

Educational Trips

- **The learners of grades VI -VII** visited the **National Museum** on **9 August, 2019**, as part of the experiential learning program. The subject experts present at the venue took the students through different sections of the museum (central asian antiquities, harappa civilization, maritime heritage and ancient coins) and educated them on the relevance of the artefacts on display. Through inquiry and creative engagements, students were able to connect the concepts learnt in their Social Science classrooms with the rich and diverse history of India. After the visit the learners held interactive sessions with the subject facilitators in the class.
- **Students of grades I and II** visited the **Kiran Nadar Museum of Art (KNMA), Noida** on **4 October 2019** and got an opportunity to look closely, engage in conversation and explore the connections between artwork and the world. The visit began with a walkthrough to see the abstract art installations, followed by an interactive story telling session that completely left them spellbound. They immersed themselves in creating their own works of craft which they brought back with them as souvenirs.
- The school organized a visit to a **Super-Market** on **18 October, 2019 for Kindergarteners**. The students were shown different sections of the super-market (fresh fruits & vegetables section etc). They were taught the process of transaction such as selecting a product, weighing and billing was demonstrated to the students. The visit was followed by an interactive discussion with the students for the reinforcement of their learning.
- The students of **German Language from grades V – VIII** visited in '**Namaste Deutschland**' event organised by Goethe Institute at **DPS Gurgaon** on **19th October, 2019**. The event had plethora of activities and competitions for German learners. Our students Shriya Gupta and Aadya Sharma (grade V) participated in Advent Calendar Workshop, Lorena Chugh and Maanit Chandna (grade VII) participated in Table Tennis Competition and Aryan Nagar (grade VIII) participated in Chess Competition. This event provided great learning opportunity for the participants.
- Students of **grades I & II** attended a **Storytelling and Performing Arts Festival - 'Istoria'** at **Prometheus School, Noida** on **18 November, 2019**. The students witnessed a plethora of performances which was a visual treat to the eyes. Children were audience to a musical, material and puppet theatre. The characters came alive on stage through the beautiful dialogues, musical enactment and dance sequences. The artists left the audience spellbound with their voice modulation, dance performances and effective use of creative puppets on the stage. The festival came to an end with a puppet making session which gave an opportunity to our learners to develop their visual-spatial and kinaesthetic intelligence. They enjoyed creating their own sock puppets which they took back home as souvenirs.

- On **30-31 January 2020**, the Astronomy Club of the school went on an educational excursion to **Sariska Tiger Reserve in Alwar District of Rajasthan**. The trip was organized with a view to acquaint students with the flora and fauna of the forest and also to explore the celestial wonders of the night sky. On the first day of the trip students got an opportunity of observing the night sky unobstructed by city lights and buildings. They got acquainted with the telescope and then were shown craters on the Moon and the planet Venus. The students also recognised constellations and learnt how to find directions using night sky. They observed constellations like Orion, Cassiopeia, Perseus, Gemini, Taurus, Canis Major etc. The students also observed deep sky objects outside our Solar System like Andromeda Galaxy(2.5 million light years), Orion Nebula(1300 light years), Pleiades Cluster, Double Star Cluster etc. The students also went on Jungle Safari on the second day of the trip and spotted various wildlife species.
- The educational excursion to **Lodhi Garden in collaboration with 'Sahapedia', on 7 February 2020 was organised for grade III students** that brought them closer to the Indian Heritage and Culture. The students explored the vast lawns and monuments of Lodhi Garden, reliving the mysteries of yester years. The young explorers, followed the map provided and grasped every detail related to the monuments of the Medieval India.
- On **5 February, 2020** students of **grade V** visited **The Prodigal Cook Farms, sector 131, Noida**, as a part of experiential and holistic development program. The Prodigal Cook Farm is an urban experiential space that aims to cater to those who care to eat clean and support a sustainable lifestyle through their ecological, zero-waste experiences and workshops. The aim of the visit was to focus on sensitizing and equipping the next generation of leaders to work towards the attainment of sustainable development goals and finding solutions for climate challenges through hands-on learning experiences that were designed for students at the farm.

Guest Speaker Programme

- An introductory session on **Model United Nations** was conducted on **03 May, 2019** for the students of **grades VII-VIII**. The guest speaker, **Mr. Rishabh Karan Mehta**, a law student, talked to the young learners of the school about the nuances of MUN. He also introduced Model United Nations to the students
- A workshop on "**Mini MBA at school using Hub and Spoke Model**" was conducted on **05 July 2020** for the teachers of LVISNE by **Mr. Amit Agarwal**, an MBA and corporate professional. The workshop focussed on the art of building key soft skills like optimism, innovation, collaboration, future readiness and adaptability. He insisted that in order to prevent social inhibition in children, they should be given opportunities to interact, communicate and collaborate as a team with people, apart from their social group. The 'Hub and Spoke' model advocated by him can facilitate collaboration between students of different calibre and interests. He encouraged teachers on involving students in projects in which, they work and interact towards achieving a common goal can lead to better social, thinking and communication skills. The teachers talked about various collaborative learning strategies which they have been implementing in their classes and the positive results, thus, seen in many students.

- A session on menstruation and menstrual hygiene was conducted on **26 July 2019** for students of **grades VI - VIII** by **Dr. Kanika Gera, Consultant Gynaecologist, Fortis Hospital, Noida**. The session gave children an opportunity to understand human body and biological process of menstruation in a female body. The speaker also gave students some useful insights into maintaining good hygiene during menstruation, potential risks of keeping poor hygiene during menstruation and ways to effectively and confidently manage the first period. The session helped the children break the taboo around the subject and raise their concerns freely.
- The students of **grades II, III, IV & V** had a unique opportunity of interacting with the renowned children's author, actor, director and child rights activist, **Ms. Nandana Dev Sen** in the session '**Author Speak**' on **01 August, 2019**. The versatile author, daughter of the Nobel Laureate Amartya Sen began the session by reading excerpts from her books. She interacted with children and shared experiences from her life that inspired her to write. Replete with life lessons, each story, interestingly narrated, left students clamouring for more. The session helped children expand the horizon of their learning.
- '**Author Speak**' session was conducted on **24 April 2019**, for the students of classes III & IV with **Ms. Madhuri Kamat** as the guest speaker. Ms. Kamat read excerpts from her book and talked about the main character - Xerxes, of her book 'Flying with Grandpa'. The students listened to her with rapt attention. Ms. Kamat took queries from the students related to the art of writing and how to become a writer. She motivated the students to write if they enjoy it as much as she does and they will also become good writers.
- The school invited **Robin Hood Army**, an organisation that channelizes food from those who have it in excess to the less fortunate sections of the society on **01 October, 2019**. The speakers sensitised children about the amount of food wasted in our country and the work that Robin Hood Army is doing to bridge the gap. They apprised the children about how the organisation works without raising funds from anyone and provide food, stationery and education to the poor. They also urged the students and teachers to become a part of this noble mission and made the children aware of the rising food wastage problem in India and across the globe.
- The school organised an interactive **Career Counseling Session** for the students of **grades VII-VIII on Law as a Prospective Career** on **02 November, 2019**. The guest speaker **Mr. Chaitanya Puri**, an alumnus of the prestigious ILS College, Pune, enlightened the students about the profession and shared his journey of becoming a lawyer. The speaker also apprised the children of the top law colleges in the country and their admission process. He also spoke about the personality traits one needs to develop in order to become a successful lawyer.

Home-School Connect

- The **Parent Orientation Program** for Kindergarten was held on **30 April 2019**, to apprise parents with the school curriculum and to give them handy tips on effective parenting. The resource person **Ms. Vinita Berry** from **Nature Nurture** gave an insight into various domains of learning and multiple intelligences which helped the parents to understand how learning takes place. One of the objectives of the orientation program was to demonstrate how the curriculum involves self-directed, hands-on learning activities which not only give direction to the child's creative talents and energies but also help in all-round holistic development of the child. The session involved engaging and interactive activities for the parents.

- **International Yoga Day** was celebrated on **11 May, 2019** by the students, teachers and parents at LVIS, Noida Extension with great enthusiasm. Students demonstrated various asanas on the song “MA TUJHE SALAM”. Parents, Students, Principal and Teachers joined in to perform Surya Namaskar and 12 other asanas with great enthusiasm. The synergy among all the stakeholders and their whole-hearted participation made the day even more special.
- The **Pre-Nursery , Nursery & Kindergarten classes** of LVIS, NE had a special celebration on **Mother’s Day on 14-15 May 2019** in the school premises. Teachers made an earnest effort to instil the importance of mother in a child’s life through effective thematic presentations, stories, dramatization and videos. The students prepared a special and unique performance to bring a smile on their mother’s face. They passionately danced and sang for their mothers. The mothers enthusiastically participated in the circle time and craft activities arranged for them and walked the ramp with their kids. The students presented to their mothers a necklace made out of clay and paper beads, which they decorated together, as a token of their love and affection.
- The **Parent Orientation Programme for Nursery** was organized on **28 September 2019** in the school premises. The session was conducted to apprise the parents with the vision of the school and the curriculum being followed. The resource person **Ms. Anuradha Sinha** gave an insight into the theme based integrated curriculum catering to multiple intelligences. The session demonstrated self-directed, hands - on learning activities which leads to holistic development of the children.
- A session on ‘**Protection Of Children Against Sexual Offense’ (POCSO-2012)** was organized by the school for the **parents of grades III-VIII on 23 November 2019 and for parents of grades Pre-Nursery –II on 2 December 2019** to build awareness amongst parents. The session was successfully conducted by the school counsellors **Ms. Ruchi Wadhwa and Ms. Japneet Kaur**. Sensitisation around the theme of good and bad touch alongside delivery of messages in a safe and non-threatening environment to children was discussed in order to ensure the safety and security of children. The parents participated enthusiastically and appreciated the content and reference material shared during the session. Post the presentation, the floor was opened for Q&A session where-in parents provided positive suggestions and said that frequent setting up of such sessions would help to re-enforce this very important message amongst the community.
- A **friendly cricket match** was organised between **Parents & Students** of Lotus Valley International School, Noida Extension on **15 February,2020** on the school ground. The student team won the toss and put up a competitive score for the parents’ team. The parents’ team chased the score and left no stone unturned in displaying their bowling capabilities in the second innings. Through this match, parents relived their childhood and they highly appreciated children’s all-out efforts and complimented the teachers & school for the opportunity provided.
- A session on **Read Programme** was held for **parents & teachers of grades III-VI on 29 February 2020** in the school premises. The resource person **Ms. Dalbir Kaur Madan** talked about reading being the heart of education. She emphasised on benefits of reading and how reading helps a child develop thinking, construct new ideas, problem solving skills and increases the power and flexibility of the brain. The session ended on a positive approach wherein parents expressed their enthusiasm to take up reading themselves in order to motivate their children.

- Students, Parents, and Staff of LVIS,NE enthusiastically participated in the **Tree Plantation Drive** held on **20 July 2019** on the field opposite to the school main gate. The students brought their own saplings and a total of 200 saplings were planted. Each sapling planted was adopted by the students and staff who pledged to nurture it. The visit empowered students to become more compassionate and make informed choices that combat real-world problems thereby making this world a better place for people, animals and the environment to live in.
